b. FLC Policy Committees

1. Finance, Taxation & Personnel

Mayor Paul Shalhoub, Town of Lake Clarke Shores

Mayor Paul Shalhoub provided a recap of his committee's policy position which was they were in support of the Communication Service Tax and Local Business Tax. The FLC's draft priority statement is as follows: "The FLC supports reforming the Communications Service Tax in a manner that is revenue neutral; provides for a broad and equitable tax base; provides for enhanced stability and reliability as an important revenue source for local government; and provides a uniform method for taxing communication services in Florida. Reform should promote a competitively neutral tax policy that will free consumers to choose a provider based on tax-neutral considerations." Next, the FLC's draft priority statement is as follows: "The FLC

supports legislation that protects general revenues collected from the local business tax. These revenues are used to provide essential municipal services such as public safety and constructing and maintaining roads and bridges, public parks and open spaces. Maintaining a diversified revenue base strengthens the fiscal stability of local governments and improves their ability to serve citizens and businesses.

2. Land Use & Economic Development

Council Chair Julia Botel, City of Riviera Beach

Council Chair Julia Botel mentioned that her committee supports annexation, and spoke about economic funding. The committee had a complex conversation on economic development for local governments.

3. Municipal Administration

Vice Mayor Kim Glas-Castro, Town of Lake Park

Vice Mayor Kim Glas-Castro's committee's focus were on two priorities: Cyber security and short-term rentals. Next month at the FLC Annual Conference, there will be more discussion.

4. Transportation & Intergovernmental Relations

Mayor Steve B. Wilson, City of Belle Glade

Mayor Steve B. Wilson's provided membership with a brief recap that included homelessness, Sadowsky funding, transportation and trains were the 4 items discussed. Councilwoman Patti Waller added that transportation would be the priority and homelessness (Sadowsky funding) are the two priorities.

A brief discussion among membership ensued.

5. Utilities, Natural Resources & Public Works
