DECLARATION PROCESS

LOCAL EMERGENCY MANAGERS RESPOND

• If local resources are exhausted:

- County officials can declare a local state of emergency
- County officials can request assistance from the State



STATE RESOURCES DEPLOYED

• If state resources are exhausted:

- Governor declares a state of emergency
- Governor requests assistance from federal government using Preliminary Damage Assessments (PDA) for a Presidential Major Disaster or Emergency Declaration

FEDERAL RESOURCES DEPLOYED

• President issues a Major Disaster or an Emergency Declaration

Know your community disaster plan before a disaster occurs

- Know key stakeholders and their roles;
- Know who's in charge;
- Know response priorities;
- Understand local State of Emergency;
- Understand the possibility of financial liability





Reinforce EM officials actions:

- Assist with declarations → ensure the damage assessment process is completed
- Consistent messages:
 - Reinforce protective actions;
 - Reinforce public information.
- Collaborate with County EOC.




